The most effective humanitarian response efforts are locally led by experienced individuals who take charge in a crisis. These individuals are the front line and create solutions that deliver immediate and far-reaching impact.

The initiative promotes transparent and efficient recruitment, by enabling humanitarians to quickly provide verifiable evidence of their skills as they transition between organisations and locations.

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
